Each year approximately 6,000 U.S. employees die from work-related injuries. Another estimated 50,000 deaths are from illnesses caused by workplace exposures. More than six million workers suffer non-fatal workplace injuries at an annual cost to U.S. businesses of more than \$125 billion.

In Fiscal Year 2012, more than 58,000 workplace accidents were reported in Kansas and 50 Kansans lost their lives due to work-related accidents.

Did you know?

Direct costs of a strain injury, including medical expenses and wages, can average more than \$27,000. Indirect costs, including lost productivity and worker replacement or retraining, can average another \$30,000.
