A Friendly Reminder

Employers must send accident reports to their insurance carrier, third party administrator or pool association for electronic submission to the Division of Workers Compensation. Per K.A.R. 51-9017, all insurance carriers, group pools and self-insurers are required to use the Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) to file both First Reports of Injury (FROI) and Subsequent Reports of Injury (SROI) using the Release 3 Standards. All claim information submitted pursuant to K.S.A. 44-4557a, and amendments there to, by EDI shall be submitted according to the Kansas EDI Release 3 Guide.

- The cost of Two-Day Registration at the upcoming Annual Workers Compensation Seminar has changed from \$140 to \$160.

- The 6th Edition American Medical Association (AMA) *Guides to Evaluation of Permanent Impairment* will be adopted by the state of Kansas in 2015. The guides recognize the importance of environmental factors and contain a new system of categorization. The 6th Edition is a general session topic the 40th Annual Workers Compensation Seminar in September.
- The Applications and Research section will no longer accept applications for hearings or requests for records via e-mail because of security concerns. The same applies to election forms. Please fax or mail these forms to the number or address provided on the form.
- The Workers Compensation Fraud and Abuse section does not investigate misconduct by insurance carriers or agents. These investigations are made by the Kansas Insurance Department.
- Generally, an employer in a non-agricultural business, with more than \$20,000 in non-family payroll, must secure workers compensation benefits for their employees. An employer can secure workers compensation benefits in one of three ways: by purchasing a workers compensation insurance policy, by joining a group-funded workers compensation pool or by qualifying as a self-insurer.



Sprick Elected to Second Term on EDI Council

David Sprick, Administrator of the Division's Technology and Statistics unit, was re-elected as the vice chair of the Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) Council. The EDI Council sets the standards for electronic filing used in many states. He was first elected as vice chair in May 2013 and was re-elected this month for another one-year term at a meeting in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Sprick has been the Kansas representative since 2006 when Kansas was appointed to the EDI council by the IAIABC president. The Council creates and maintains the EDI reporting standards that all states/jurisdictions use for workers' compensation reporting of claims, proof of insurance coverage and medical bill reporting.



According to Sprick, they are piloting the extensible markup language (XML) version of the claims standard as the current claims standards are all reported in a "flat file" format. "We will implement that in July of this year and once that is tested, other states can use the EDI XML claims reporting standard. I have been involved with the XML project since 2007. I have been on the EDI committees since I began with the division in 2000, ran EDI training from 2003-06," he said.

International Classification of Diseases (ICD)-10



ICD-10 is the 10th revision of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD). On Oct. 1, 2014, the ICD-10 code sets will replace the ICD-9. During this current transition period, a number of health care insurance carriers have already begun using and/or recognizing the ICD-10 codes. Although not mandated by Kansas Workers Compensation, it is strongly recommended that ICD-10 be employed for billing purposes on the CMS-1500 form, or an equivalent form containing the same information.
